Board meeting minutes for Wednesday, August 31, 2023 Park Community Center

The meeting began at 6:00 pm with Kayla Robison calling the meeting to order. Board Members missing were: Fran Schumann, and Wyman Satchel. Board Members present were: Kayla Robison, City Rep Holly Jo Karren, KarLee Roberts, Tori Fischer, Alexia Lott, Annie Griffiths, Richard Carlson, Wayne Henderson, and Lora Smith. Minutes from the January and May meetings were then read by Annie Griffiths. Motion to approve the minutes as read was made by Tori Fischer and Richard Carlson—respectively— and both were seconded by KarLee Roberts.

Reports from Board Members were then Presented.

  well, and the group agreed to continue to do this next summer. She then shared the next planned
  teen activity for September; the activity will include cornhole and yard games.
- RCYC representatives had no necessary updates for the board.
- The board discussed ideas for Park Bench's book checkout program, and brought up sending childrens books, along with the adult books, for grandparents to read to their grandkids. Further coordination will go into this program, and its success.
- Richard Carlson encouraged the library to continue having a positive social media presence, and further explore the aforementioned library logo and merchandise ideas.
- Wayne Henderson then shared an idea he'd gotten from his grandchildren's local library about
  having a library mascot (potentially a cow hinting at the town's culture, or a bookworm) to hide in
  the library monthly. This would be a passive program aimed to increase excitement from younger
  members of the community about coming to the library.
- Lora Smith then did a Directors report which included the board viewing a budget report (refer to attached), and reviewing the strategic plan. Discussion over the strategic plan is to be continued at the next meeting.
