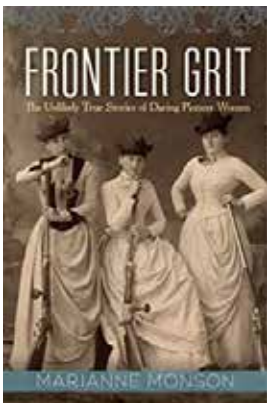

Voting Information

The USPS sent a postcard in September with incorrect information on voting in Utah. Below is information from the Utah Office of Elections with the correct information.

The postcard encourages recipients to “request your mail-in ballot... at least 15 days before Election Day”. In Utah, all active registered voters in Utah automatically receive their ballots in the mail. Individuals do not need to request a mail-in ballot separately if they have previously registered to vote.

Voters are encouraged to plan ahead by going to vote.utah.gov to check their registration status, register to vote, or update their address.

County clerks say they will mail ballots to all active registered voters the week of October 13, 2020, and voters have until 5:00 p.m. on Friday, October 23, 2020 to register to vote and automatically receive a mail ballot.

For voting information specific to Cache County, visit cachecounty.org/elections/. Ballots may be returned through the mail or at the drop-off box outside the city office.

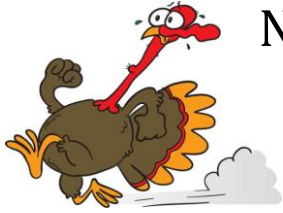
