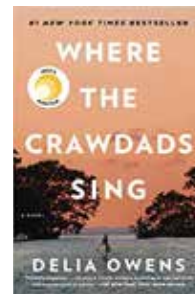

Where the Crawdads Sing by
Delia Owens

For years, rumors of the “Marsh Girl” have haunted Barkley Cove, a quiet town on the North Carolina coast. So in late 1969, when handsome Chase Andrews is found dead, the locals immediately suspect Kya Clark, the so-called Marsh Girl. But Kya is not what they say. Sensitive and intelligent, she has survived for years alone in the marsh that she calls home, finding friends in the gulls and lessons in the sand.

Where the Crawdads Sing is at once an exquisite ode to the natural world, a heartbreaking coming-of-age story, and a surprising tale of possible murder. Owens reminds us that we are forever shaped by the children we once were, and that we are all subject to the beautiful and violent secrets that nature keeps.

Winter Parking Restrictions

The winter parking restrictions are in effect from November 1st to March 31st. No parking on the street or City right-of-way is permitted between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m. The city assumes no liability for damage to personal property that occurs when it is

placed in the city right-of-way (i.e. from snow plows).

During these winter months, please move your garbage and recycle cans off the edge of the street just as soon as you possibly can after garbage/ recycle pick-up. The snowplows do the best they can to avoid striking them but, on some streets and in heavy snow, it can be difficult. Your assistance is appreciated.

And please clear your sidewalks after snow falls!

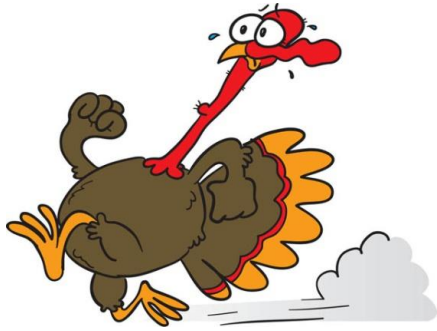
