City Office Changes

HollyJo Karren, deputy treasurer, has accepted another job; her last day was December 31st. We wish her well in her new endeavor.

Beginning Monday, January 4, 2021, the city office will be open from **9:00 am to 3:00 pm**.

The office will be closed January 1st and 18th.

Business Licenses

Business licenses need to be renewed every January. Your license is ready to pick up at the city office. The fee is \$25.

Dog & Kennel Licenses

All dog and kennel licenses expire on December 31st each year. During January and February, fees are \$5 for each spayed or neutered dog and \$10 for an intact dog; these double beginning March 1st.

The kennel fee is \$50 each year if you pay in January or February. Beginning March 1st, the fee doubles to \$100.

No Rabies Clinic will be held in 2021.

Public Meeting Schedule

All meetings will be held at the Park Community Center at 90 South 100 West.

Planning & Zoning Commission: First Tuesday of each month starting at 6:30 pm.

City Council: Third Tuesday of each month starting at 6:30 pm.

Winter Parking Restrictions

The winter parking restrictions are in effect until March 31, 2021. No parking on the street or City right-of-way is permitted between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m. The city assumes no liability for damage to personal property that occurs when it is placed in the city right-of-way. And please clear your sidewalks after snow falls!

During these winter months, please move your garbage and recycling cans off the edge of the street after garbage pick-up. The snowplows do the best they can to avoid striking them but, on some streets and in heavy snow, it can be difficult. Your assistance is appreciated.

Remove snow within a 3-foot perimeter of the fire hydrant and shovel a pathway from the hydrant to the street so firefighters can access it. Also, clear snow around roadside mailboxes to allow the carrier to safely approach and exit from the mailbox.

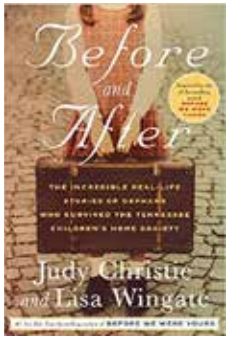

The [Home Energy Assistance Target \(HEAT\)](#) program provides winter utility assistance to low-income households targeting those who are truly vulnerable – the lowest-income households with the highest heating costs, the disabled, elderly, and families with preschool-age children. This service is funded through the U.S. Department of Energy Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP). Appointments are scheduled on a first-come first-served basis.
