Business Licenses

Business licenses need to be renewed every January. Your license is ready to pick up at the city office. The fee is \$25.

Dog & Kennel Licenses

All dog and kennel licenses expire on December 31st each year. During January and February, fees are \$5 for each spayed or neutered dog and \$10 for an intact dog; these double beginning March 1st.

The kennel fee is \$50 each year if you pay in January or February. Beginning March 1st, the fee doubles to \$100.

No Rabies Clinic will be held in 2021.

Winter Parking Restrictions

The winter parking restrictions are in effect until March 31, 2021. No parking on the street or City right-of-way is permitted between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m. The city assumes no liability for damage to personal property that occurs when it is placed in the city right-of-way. And please clear your sidewalks after snow falls!

\$1 Increase on Utility Bill

Last September, the Cache County Council acting in their capacity as the Board of Trustees for Cache County Service Area No. 1 (which covers all residents outside of Logan City) approved new fees for the green waste drop sites and for the compost facility at the Logan Landfill.

Each fee is 50 cents per month per household for a total increase of \$1. These fees were applied beginning January 1st.

The Richmond drop site will be located at the city Maintenance Shop (590 W 200 S). More details will be provided in the March newsletter.

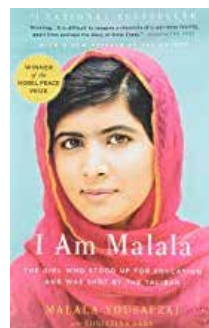

HEAT Utility Assistance Program

The [Home Energy Assistance Target \(HEAT\)](#) program provides winter utility assistance to low-income households targeting those who are truly vulnerable – the lowest-income households with the highest heating costs, the disabled, elderly, and families with preschool-age children. This service is funded through the U.S. Department of Energy Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP). Appointments are scheduled on a first-come first-served basis.

Planning & Zoning

Appointed by the City Council, P&Z is an advisory commission to the council in all matters dealing with land use. Among those duties are to review and recommend the General Plan and amendments to the plan; review LUDMO (Land Use, Development, and Management Ordinances) and zoning maps; review, gather data, and recommend approval/denial of subdivisions, planned unit developments, and rezone requests; and other duties assigned by the council and the city ordinances.

We had a few changes to membership of P&Z in the last few months. Vern Fielding stepped down in



December at the end of his term; city council liaison Terrie Wierenga thanked Vern and presented him with a commemorative clock.

The current Planning & Zoning members are Jessica

Dunyon, chair; Jay Bair, Cache Christensen, Amber Ervin, Sharik Peck, and Jordan Knutson.

Cache Mosquito Abatement District trustee

Richmond City Council appoints a resident to the Board of Trustees every four years. Don Sheffer began his term in January.

Cache Valley Transit trustee

Terrie Wierenga was appointed to serve on the Board of Trustees of the Cache Valley Transit District last October. The CVTD was awarded an

\$18 million federal grant last year for a new maintenance/administration facility and will begin design and construction this year.
