Municipal Election November 2nd

The election will be vote-by-mail. Registered voters are not required to fill out an application for the vote-by-mail ballot. Each registered voter will be mailed a ballot and instructions for returning the ballot. Ballots will be mailed the week of October 11. Drought

Despite recent monsoonal storms, extreme drought conditions continue to plague the state. Utah relies most heavily on snowpack for its water – however, rain and snow both play essential roles in recovering from the drought. This much-needed rain has helped reduce wildfire risk and temporarily improve soil moisture and streamflows. The storms have not, however, pulled us out of this drought.

Hopefully, steady rain and snow will continue into this winter when it will have the most significant impact on drought conditions.
