From the City:

Municipal Election November 2nd

Richmond City is conducting the November 2, 2021 General Election by mail. Please note that on Election Day there will be no polling place. To vote in the election, a person must be a registered voter residing in Richmond City.

Follow the instructions that are included with the by-mail ballot and sign the envelope where indicated.

For your ballot to be counted, it must be mailed (postage affixed) and clearly postmarked **before** Election Day (no later than November 1, 2021), or you may drop your ballot off at the official ballot drop box located at the Park Community Center, 90 South 100 West, Richmond on Election Day (November 2, 2021) no later than 8:00 pm.

Winter Parking

The winter parking restrictions are in effect from November 1st to March 31st. No parking on the street or City right-of-way is permitted between 10 pm and 7 am. The city assumes no liability for

damage to personal property that occurs when it is placed in the city right-of-way.

During these winter months, please move your garbage and recycle cans off the edge of the street just as soon as you possibly can after garbage/recycle pick-up. The snowplows do the best they can to avoid striking them but, on some streets and in heavy snow, it can be difficult. Your assistance is appreciated.

And please clear your sidewalks after snow falls!

Green Waste Bin

The Green Waste Bin at the city maintenance shed will be removed for the season on November 19th. After that date, you can take green waste to the Green Waste Facility at the Logan Landfill (153 N 1400 W, Logan). Remember that all loads entering and exiting the Green Waste Facility must be covered. There is a \$10.00 fee charged for uncovered loads.




